Leadership: Justly Judging in Discipline Situations

Give therefore thy servant an understanding heart to judge thy people, that I may discern between good and bad: for who is able to judge this thy so great a people? (1 Kings 3:9)

For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son in whom he delighteth. (Proverbs 3:12)

He that justifieth the wicked, and he that condemneth the just, even they both are abomination to the LORD. (Proverbs 17:15)

Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying. (Proverbs 19:18)

These things also belong to the wise. It is not good to have respect of persons in judgment. (Proverbs 24:23)

These are the things that ye shall do; Speak ye every man the truth to his neighbour; execute the judgment of truth and peace in your gates: (Zechariah 8:16)

Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment. (John 7:24)

Leadership: Managing the Household

The hand of the diligent shall bear rule: but the slothful shall be under tribute. (Proverbs 12:24)

Be thou diligent to know the state of thy flocks, and look well to thy herds. (Proverbs 27:23) One that ruleth well his own house, having his children in subjection with all gravity; (1 Timothy 3:4)

Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being ensamples to the flock. (1 Peter 5:2-3)

Leadership: Leading in Family Worship

The living, the living, he shall praise thee, as I do this day: the father to the children shall make known thy truth. (Isaiah 38:19)

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. (Colossians 3:16)

But exhort one another daily, while it is called Today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin. (Hebrews 3:13)

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much. (James 5:16)

Leadership: Providing a Godly Example

I will behave myself wisely in a perfect way. O when wilt thou come unto me? I will walk within my house with a perfect heart. (Psalm 101:2)

I have taught thee in the way of wisdom; I have led thee in right paths. (Proverbs 4:11)

Make no friendship with an angry man; and with a furious man thou shalt not go:

lest thou learn his ways, and get a snare to thy soul. (Proverbs 22:24-25)

If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. (John 13:14-15)

Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ. (1 Corinthians 11:1) Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark them which walk so as ye have us for an ensample. (Philippians 3:17)

Those things, which ye have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me, do: and the God of peace shall be with you. (Philippians 4:9)

Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity. (1 Timothy 4:12)

In all things showing thyself a pattern of good works: in doctrine showing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity,

sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you. (Titus 2:7-8)

For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:

who did no sin, neither was guile found in his mouth:

who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:

who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed. (1 Peter 2:21-24)
